

# COVID-19 ADDITIONAL DOSE AND BOOSTER INFORMATION

The FDA has authorized a booster dose of all three U.S. COVID-19 vaccines — Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. The Pfizer-BioNTech booster is available for all people 12 and older. The Moderna and Johnson & Johnson boosters are available for all people 18 and older. Those who are immunocompromised are eligible to get an additional (third) dose of Moderna or Pfizer.

## SHOULD YOU CONSIDER A COVID-19 VACCINE BOOSTER OR AN ADDITIONAL (THIRD) DOSE?

	Additional (Third) Dose	Booster (You may choose any of the three FDA-authorized vaccines for your booster dose if you are 18 years of age or older.)
Received Pfizer first and second doses	<b>Yes</b> , if you are immunocompromised and it has been 28 days since your second dose. <sup>1</sup> You are also eligible for a booster (fourth) dose five months after your third dose.	<b>Yes</b> , if you are 12+ AND it has been five months since your second dose.
Received Moderna first and second doses	<b>Yes</b> , if you are immunocompromised and it has been 28 days since your second dose. <sup>1</sup> You are also eligible for a booster (fourth) dose five months after your third dose.	<b>Yes</b> , if you are 18+ AND it has been five months since your second dose.
Received Johnson & Johnson single dose	<b>No.</b>	<b>Yes</b> , if you are 18+ AND it has been two months since your first dose.

<sup>1</sup> Immunocompromised individuals are recipients of stem cell or organ transplants, those receiving treatment for HIV or cancer, or those taking immunosuppressive drugs. Providers may also consider age of 65+ and long-term care residency as qualifying factors, along with other health conditions.
